## WHAT'S YOUR WHY? WHY DID YOU CHOOSE TO WORK AT METRO UNITED WAY, A MISSION-DRIVEN ORGANIZATION?

This two-part question posed by our amazing President & CEO Adria Johnson at the opening of our staff retreat in April has been on my mind every day since. As part of my introduction of this illustrious newsletter, it only felt right to share my WHY:

I truly love this place we all call home. It's the place I am making a home with the love of my life, Jimmy, and our four adorably neurotic pets Constant, Chunk, Krampus, and Norma Jean. But for all of the reasons I love this area – proximity to family, the sense of community, the food, the bourbon – the issues we are facing are also very real. We are not an equitable community *yet*.

In 2023, inequity looks like:

- Only 44% of children in Kentucky enter kindergarten ready to learn. When children start behind, they tend to stay behind.
- 170,000+ children in Kentucky are food insecure.
- In our region, non-white children are 4.3 times more likely to grow up in low-opportunity neighborhoods.
- In our region, 67% of Hispanic and non-Hispanic Black residents receive early prenatal care compared to 80% of white mothers.

These are just a few examples of the disparities we must work to address. But time and time again in my own life, I have seen the great things that can happen when folks come together to drive positive and sustainable change. I believe collectively we can uplift our communities and one another!

I'm looking forward to getting to know each of you as we journey to transform this place we love for the better.

# IMPACT SPOTLIGHT: RECENT WINS! (AND WORK AHEAD OF US)

## FundBlackFounders: ENHANCING ACCESS TO CAPITAL

The statistics speak loudly. Only 1% of start-up capital in this country accrues to Black business owners, and the average Black-owned business starts with \$35,000 compared to \$107,000 for white businesses.

To impact this inequity, Metro United Way recently invested \$500,000 in 13 local Black entrepreneurs through a partnership with FundBLACKFounders. This vital funding provides up to \$25,000 per person in matching grants and a 14-week, cohort-based coaching program.

### YOUTH SUCCESS FUNDING ANNOUNCED

MUW recently reviewed \$7 million worth of funding requests from more than 100 local nonprofits serving youth across our seven-county region. When completed, Community Impact Cabinet volunteers invested over \$1 million in 37 agencies, 29 of which are BIPOC-led or grassroots organizations, that will deliver more than 21,000 youth programming hours and benefit more than 6,000 young people in the first year of a two-year cycle.

The funding gap of \$6 million – which left 69 organizations and over 40,000 hours of programming unfunded – highlights challenges and opportunities ahead for our community and MUW's many committed volunteers, contributors, and staff. Read more by using the QR code to the right.



## **MORE THAN \$6 MILLION IN ARPA GRANTS AWARDED**

The culmination of two+ years of determined and collaborative work, MUW secured more than \$6 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant money. Over \$1.8 million was the result of advocacy efforts by MUW staff and our Ready for K Alliance, contributing to Louisville Metro Council making a historic investment in our community's early childhood ecosystem in June of this year. Almost \$1.2 million will also come to our community to expand youth success activities, including professional development and technical assistance for those doing the work. Last, ARPA awarded MUW \$3 million to support workplace development through strengths-based financial coaching, DE&I training, and grants for underrepresented entrepreneurs.
