Here is the work that we are currently investing in and leading in Bullitt County.

FREE 211 HELPLINE

Available to anyone in the county to be connected to resources. Residents can call 211, text their zip code to 898211, or search our online database of resources: metrounitedway.org/get-help

FREE, DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING PROGRAM

For parents and caregivers of children 0-5 ½ and available to all residents. It's called our Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ) program and helps parents and caregivers better understand a child's development. Free books and activities are sent after each screening is complete. Visit metrounitedway.org/asq to learn more and sign-up.

YOUTH SUCCESS NETWORK

Available to any youth-serving organization and currently two in Bullitt County are part of the network that provides resources, capacity building, training, and more support for those organizations that serve youth outside of school hours. And most recently, another organization was provided funding from our Hardship to Hope Youth Summer Fund.

TRANSPORTATION FOR STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

In 2025, we were proud to obtain funding from Ford Philanthropy to help tackle one of the most persistent challenges faced by income-limited families – reliable transportation. This went directly to Bullitt County Public School's McKinney-Vento Program, which serves students experiencing homelessness. Already, we've had a participant of this program receive college scholarships!

FAMILY HOMELESSNESS AND SCHOOL MOBILITY PREVENTION

We recently expanded our Siemer Institute initiative to the Multi-Purpose Community Action Agency in Bullitt County.

INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

During tax season and our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, we provide volunteers to help qualifying individuals in Bullitt County with their taxes.

GROCERY CARDS DURING SNAP PAUSE

In 2025 when Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits were temporarily discontinued, more than 60,000 households in our service area, including Bullitt County, were affected. We acted quickly and provided qualifying families a way to apply for digital grocery cards to help provide sustenance.
